Educator's note: Many major cultural institutions now release public-domain images or CC0 copies you can use without permission; others have mixed rights—always check the rights statement on the item page.

[Library of Congress — Prints & Photographs / Chronicling America](#)

Large collection of photographs, prints, posters, maps, sheet music, and digitized newspapers (Chronicling America). Various items are public domain; each showing the rights information along with the image.

[National Archives \(NARA\)](#)

Official federal records: military photos, government portraits, WPA, Farm Security Administration, aerial surveys, maps. Various images with the appropriate right information on each record.

[Smithsonian Open Access](#)

The Smithsonian Open Access contains resources from The Smithsonian's 21 museums, nine research centers, libraries, archives, and the National Zoo. Filter the search for photographs in the open access search bar.

[Digital Public Library of America \(DPLA\)](#)

A website that organizes images and artifacts from many organizations, including libraries, archives, and museums across the U.S. Search using filters for rights and photographs of people.

A website where participating institutions contribute images in the public domain.
